By the end of the week, when given two biographical informational texts on the same topic, the students will be able to evaluate their own objective summaries by comparing and contrasting them to analyze how different authors shape their presentations of key information with an accuracy of at least 70% as measured through evaluating Venn Diagram artifacts.
